Preamble

Out of 15 members of the Academic Staff, only two members did not complete the PMS assessment tool. The reasons were that one member returned from Sabbatical Leave in September 2019, while the other also returned from further studies at the end of the year 2019. The departmental performance ranged from 51% to 95%. Although the score is 81.6%, which may be regarded as above Average performance, the Department has two members (that is, an Associate Professor and Senior Lecturer) who respectively scored below average; the one achieved 66%, while the other performed poorly with 52%.

Both the teaching and service areas of assessment remain highly subjective and open to abuse. The University needs to improve the tool for quality results. For analysis, I will, therefore, focus on performance at the area of research and publications; and they are as follow:
